

New Zealand Diploma in Aviation (Level 6)

For admission applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Need to be 18 years of age
- Hold a NZ CAA Class 1 medical
- Have NCEA Level 3 Certificate with;
 - ➔ at least 14 x Level 3 credits in a language-rich subject (e.g. but not limited to English, history, art, geography, biology) and
 - ➔ at least 14 x Level 3 credits in a numbers-oriented subject (e.g.. but not limited to, calculus, statistics, physics, chemistry, accounting or economics.
- or
 - ➔ A trade qualification at Level 4 or above
- or
 - ➔ A pass in all (six) Private Pilot Licence (PPL) exams
- Fit & Proper Person

Be prepared to undergo a Civil Aviation Authority security check disclosing up-to-date criminal convictions report from the Justice Department and traffic offence history report from the Land Transport Authority.
- Students are expected to have attained acceptable level of English language proficiency. This may be demonstrated in a variety of ways i.e. successful academic study in English, four years' secondary schooling in a country where the first language is English; minimum IELTS score of 6.0; or in another English Language test that is recognized by the CAA
- Demonstrate the ability to undertake the entire programme with good prospects of success. Some experience in aviation would be an advantage.

As part of the screening process all applicants will be required to undertake an online Pilot Aptitude Test. The duration of this test is approx 20 minutes and is capable to provide information on the applicant's hand and eye co ordination and ability to learn.

After the screening process applicants will be invited to an interview where other areas would be assessed including; academic achievements, work experience (if any), maturity & motivation, honesty and self awareness, communication skills, teamwork skills, leadership skills, analytical skills and technical skills.
